

YEAH – The heat of summer is over and the cold winter temperatures and icy roads are still weeks away. But riding in the fall/autumn creates a unique hazard: "WET LEAVES".

The leaves may look beautiful scattered across the road, but once rain or dew comes in contact with them, they will become slick, slippery and treacherous as ice.

Why Wet Leaves Are So Slippery

Even on a dry day a road covered in leaves is already risky: by hiding lane markings, potholes or debris. When moisture is added, the leaves become a thin, slick layer between your tires and the road.

Here's why:

Natural Oils: As leaves decompose, they release oils that reduce traction Absorb Moisture: Wet leaves hold water like a sponge, creating a slimy surface Piled Hazards: Accumulated leaves act like a mat, preventing the tires from

gripping properly

Result: Bike or car will behave like it is on black ice, stopping distances increase, steering is less responsive and sudden movements can cause skids.

Steps to reduce risk during leaf season:

Slow Down: Reduce your speed on leaf-covered roads, especially after rain Increase Following Distance: Give yourself extra space to stop

Curves & amp; Intersections: Leaves collect here and can make turning especially slippery

Leaf Piles: Avoid, as they be hiding hazards, animals or even children playing

It is easy to overlook leaves compared to snow. Wet leaves create dangers that rival icy conditions. Stay aware and cautious as you enjoy the autumn season's scenery while staying safe on the road.

Treasurers, please do not be afraid to ask questions of the Chapter Directors or myself. It is essential to ensure that you keep the Chapter Director up to date on your monthly financial reports. How you do that is up to you.
